DCAL Program Details

- Courses are free to current CAI homeowner and CAVL (Community Association Volunteer Leader) members. Fee for nonmembers is \$35 per course.
- A participant registration form is to be filled out to begin the DCAL program.
- A CAVL should complete the program within 24 months.
- Non-members of CAI are welcome to attend courses for education purposes; however to obtain the DCAL recognition, an attendee must be an active member of CAI.
- Continuing education will be required to maintain the DCAL Recognition on a yearly basis.
